History

- **U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt originally created Mount Olympus National Monument on 2 March 1909.**
- **It was designated a national park by President Franklin Roosevelt on June 29, 1938.**
- **In 1976, Olympic National Park was designated by UNESCO as an International Biosphere Reserve, and in 1981 as a World Heritage Site.**
- **In 1988, Congress designated 95 percent of the park as the Olympic Wilderness**



Fauna

- Animals that inhabit this national park are , squirrels, skunks, six species of bats, , coyotes, , beavers, red foxes, mountain goats, bobcats, black bears, hares.
- Whales, dolphins, sea lions, seals, and sea otters swim near this park.
- Birds that fly in this park including raptors are Winter wrens, ravens, spotted owls, bald eagles, band-tailed pigeons.
